Pim Brouwers, PhD is the Associate Director for Infant, Child, & Adolescent Research Programs and Chief of the Primary Prevention Branch for the Center for Mental Health Research on AIDS in the Division of AIDS and Health & Behavior Research, part of the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), at the National Institutes of Health (NIH) in Bethesda, MD.

Dr. Brouwers holds degrees in Experimental Psychology & Methodology and Neuropsychology from Leiden University and McGill University. His main research interests are in the neurobehavioral consequences of chronic medical illness, particularly cancer and HIV, and its treatment in children and adults and factors that mediate or moderate outcome. He also conducts studies on methodological and statistical issues of serial neurobehavioral assessment in clinical trials and longitudinal studies.
