

***HUGH HENDRIE, MB, ChB, DSc***

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Dr. Hugh Hendrie is co-principal investigator of a multi-disciplinary group of researchers conducting international comparative studies of dementia and Alzheimer's disease in Nigeria and the United States, supported by the NIA. He is a member of the steering committee of the NIA-supported Indiana Alzheimer Disease Center. He also chaired a NIH committee on factors influencing cognitive and emotional health and is on the steering committee of the CDC/AA Healthy Brain-Maintaining Cognitive Health project. Dr. Hendrie collaborates on intervention trials for the treatment of depression and dementia in primary care, and in conducting surveys of retired physicians and their spouses, focusing on predictors of life satisfaction.

Dr. Hendrie has written over 400 articles, book chapters and published abstracts on various topics in psychiatry, particularly psychogeriatrics. He received degrees from the University of Glasgow, University of Manitoba and Wayne State University. Retiring after 25 years as Chairman of the Psychiatry Department at Indiana University, he continues to work as a professor of psychiatry and research scientist. In April 2000, he received the John W. Ryan Award for Distinguished Contribution to International Programs and Studies from IU. Dr. Hendrie has received numerous awards from AACP, APA and National Alzheimer's Association.
