Sandra Weintraub, PhD is Professor of Psychiatry and Neurology at Northwestern University Medical School and the Director of Neuropsychology in the Cognitive Neurology and Alzheimer's Disease Center (CNADC). She is the Associate Director of a training grant awarded by the National Institute on Aging (NIA), entitled "Mechanisms of Aging and Dementia" to Northwestern University Integrated Neuroscience (NUIN) Program. She has been the director of the Clinical Core of the Northwestern CNADC funded by the NIA without interruption since 1996. Dr. Weintraub has been awarded independent research grants from the National Institute on Aging and the Illinois Department of Public Health. She has authored over 100 articles and book chapters on the neuropsychology of dementia and aging, and her special research interest is primary progressive aphasia. Dr. Weintraub was one of the two Scientific Honorees recognized at the Rita Hayworth Gala of the National Alzheimer's Association in 1997. She is a member of the board of directors of the Greater Illinois Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association. She currently serves on the Alzheimer's Disease Clinical Task Force, a special advisory committee to the National Institute on Aging given the mandate to create a common dataset for all the Alzheimer's centers across the USA.
